IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Based on guidance from the California Department of Public Health and the California Governor's Stay at Home Executive Order N-33-20 issued on March 19, 2020 to protect the health and well-being of all Californian's and to establish consistency across the state in order to slow the spread of COVID-19, the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) meeting will not provide in-person participation.

We have established alternative methods of participation in the JJCC meetings, pursuant to the California Governor's Executive Order N-29-20, which states:

- Providing an opportunity to "observe and address" telephonically or otherwise electronically, alone, meets the requirement; and
- Removing the former requirement from Executive Order N-25-20 of having "at least one publicly accessible" location from which the public may observe and offer comment. Executive Order N-29-20 now states expressly, "Such a body need not make available any physical location from which members of the public may observe the meeting and offer public comment."

The following alternative methods of participation are available to the public. If you wish to make a general public comment or to comment on a specific agenda item, the following methods are available:


Convene the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) Meeting

- 5. FY 2021-22 Juvenile Justice Realignment Plan (JJRP) DCPO Holly Benton and DCPO Kimberly Shean

Senate Bill (SB) 823, passed by the California State Legislature on August 31, 2020 and enrolled September 4, 2020, created the Office of Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR), prohibits the commitment of additional youth to the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) effective July 1, 2021, and realigns responsibility for those youth to the counties. This legislation further requires that there shall be a Juvenile Justice Realignment Subcommittee of the JJCC, which is statutorily required to develop a separate Plan, "...describing the facilities, programs, placements, services, supervision and reentry strategies that are needed to provide appropriate rehabilitation and supervision services for the youth who are realigned from the state Division of Juvenile Justice to county based custody, care, and supervision or who were otherwise eligible for commitment to the Division of Juvenile Justice prior to its closure."

- **6.** Racial and Ethnic Equity and Inclusion (REEI) Data Presentation Department of Social Services (DSS) Deputy Director Amy Krueger

The Probation Department continues to review, analyze and share data with the public and partner agencies regarding REEI. This has included REEI demographic breakdowns and presentation of the Relative Rate Index (RRI), which compares youth of different racial groups involved in the juvenile justice system relative to their overall percentage in the population. The RRI also provided an opportunity to review disparities at specific system decision points. In 2021, an invitation was extended to other child-serving agencies to share their data at various system decision points to create a full picture of REEI data throughout the county, not just within the juvenile justice system, but at earlier points of system involvement in our communities.

8. JJCC Workgroup Appointments – Chief Tanja Heitman

The JJCC Workgroup is tasked with collaborating on the development of the Comprehensive Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan (CMJJP), as well as identifying priorities and strategies for the local juvenile justice system, and provides recommendations to the JJCC. Due to personnel and assignment changes in member agencies, JJCC Workgroup membership is changing.

9. Los Prietos Boys Camp (LPBC) Redesign Update – DCPO Kimberly Shean

Across the country, juvenile justice systems are evolving in response to research about adolescent brain development, Positive Youth Development (PYD), trauma informed care, and other youth-centered approaches. In an effort to best incorporate these approaches, the Santa Barbara County Probation Department and internal stakeholders have worked to redesign the LPBC program to best implement these approaches in positive and meaningful way. Program changes are currently being piloted at the Camp.
