# 2. Approval of Minutes from December 7, 2018 - All

 A motion was made by Jill Frandsen and seconded by Chief Hansen, to approve the December 7, 2018, meeting minutes as submitted. A vote was taken and minutes were approved.

# 4. Comments for Council Members not on Agenda

• Jill Frandsen brought up a concern regarding the effects of nicotine and vaping on our youth. The Chief suggested having a presentation on this topic by the Public Health Department at an upcoming JJCC meeting.

### 5. Chief Probation Officer Comments – Tanja Heitman

- Chief Heitman welcomed Supervisor Hart to the JJCC meeting. Ethan Bertrand will be appointed to the workgroup.
- As a reminder the Probation Department invites everyone to attend our annual Staff Recognition Award Dinner on March 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Governor Newsom is recommending the Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) be moved under the oversight of the Health and Human Services Division. There is the possibility that the supervision of the youth sent to DJJ will be returned to the County of origin. Additional information will be provided as it is made available.

# 6. Positive Achievement Change Tool (PACT) – Karyn Milligan

• Ms. Milligan provided a PowerPoint presentation to review the purpose and functions of this assessment tool and the reasons for its selection as Probation's new risk/needs assessment.

# 7. Continuum of Care Reform (CCR) Implementation Progress – Holly Benton

• DCPO Benton presented on the department's CCR implementation status and the group discussed the information.

- Group Homes that want to continue to serve youth must transition to Short Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP). Many former group homes are currently in process to become provisionally licensed as an STRTP. Group homes which do not want to become licensed as an STRTP must either close or transition to a different model of service. Some facilities are not equipped to proceed with this change, and as a result, we may lose placement beds over time.
- Dr. Gleghorn stated these facilities essentially need to become mental health treatment facilities, which is a big change for them.
- The Chief stated San Luis Obispo Probation has a model where they are using a wing of their juvenile hall as a treatment facility, which does not qualify for the Federal funding through STRTP. The County agreed to give Probation the County share for utilizing out of home placements, which resulted in them not able place in STRTPs. There are challenges with this model and at this time SLO is the only County that has opted to try this model.
- 8. Comprehensive Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan (CMJJP) Update Holly Benton
  - JJCC Workgroup has been discussing gaps in services and will be reviewing objectives and goals for next year. There has been an extensive discussion regarding diversion.
  - At the April JJCC meeting the CMJJP goals and objectives will be presented.
