The Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) is seeking representatives for its JJCC Workgroup.

In 2017, the Probation Department undertook a comprehensive data mining and county comparison project, and examined that data closely. Over the last two years, the Department has introduced new strategies, tools and evidence-based approaches to its work with youth throughout the county. One of those changes was the introduction of a JJCC Workgroup, to be more inclusive of county and community partners as we continue to pursue these strategic changes.

In order to ensure robust discussions of important issues, the Department would like to add a community-based organization representative (non-profit) to the JJCC Workgroup, in addition to the traditional juvenile justice partners who now participate.
