SUPERVISION OF DEFENDANTS IN THE ARMED FORCES

I. Defendants in Armed Forces at the Time Probation is Granted

- A. Immediately upon the grant of supervised probation, the defendant is responsible to report to the Probation Department. An intake interview and COMPAS assessment will be conducted.
- B. If probation instructions were <u>not</u> given to the defendant prior to return to his/her out of county military base, the assigned DPO will contact the defendant. If s/he is unable to return to our area an intake and COMPAS assessment will be conducted over the telephone. At the conclusion of that interview reporting instructions will be arranged. There will be occasions when a Release of Information or other forms will require the defendant's signature. If so, the assigned DPO will send the appropriate paperwork with detailed instructions, directing the defendant to sign the indicated paperwork and return them within a specified period of time. Monthly Report Forms and financial payment information should be included as appropriate.
- C. The assigned DPO will direct the defendant to provide a copy of their military orders to confirm where s/he will be residing and for how long.
- D. As appropriate, 1203.9 PC Transfer or Interstate Supervision (ICAOS) may be requested. Please refer to Chapter 3206 of this manual for further information regarding 1203.9 PC transfers.

Note: This is one of the few instances which ICAOS requires the receiving state to issue reporting instructions and the transfer of supervision within 2 business days, without verification of residency.

II. Defendants Wishing to Enter Armed Forces After Probation is Granted

A. Should a defendant express a desire to enter the Armed Forces, the assigned DPO shall consider the advisability and legal feasibility of recommending early termination of probation on its own merits, keeping in mind that the person may later be deemed unacceptable for service or he/she may change his/her mind and not seek enlistment after the Court's jurisdiction terminates.
