Bail Procedures for Youth Found Unfit For Juvenile Court Pursuant to 707(b) WIC & Prop 57 Filings

I. <u>Procedures</u>

- A. The following procedures have been developed in consultation with the Sheriff's Office and have been approved by the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court.
 - 1. The Juvenile Court Judge may find a youth is unfit for treatment as a juvenile or the District Attorney's office may elect to direct file a complaint in the Adult Court.
 - 2. The youth is to remain at Juvenile Hall, pending an Own Recognizance/Bail Review (OR/BR) hearing.
 - 3. The bail transaction will occur at the Sheriff's Office.
 - a. A copy of the receipt showing bail has been posted, or *Own Recognizance* authorized, must be presented at Juvenile Hall prior to the youth's release.
 - b. Prior to releasing a youth on *Own Recognizance* or bail, the Supervising Probation Officer (SPO) or Manager must be notified and provide final authorization. A determination will be made after reviewing all existing court matters (Juvenile and Adult Courts).
 - 4. If a youth is released on Own Recognizance or bail, Juvenile Hall staff will not handle remands or orders for further appearance, unless the youth is re-arrested.
 - a. Orders shall be forwarded immediately to Inmate Records at the Santa Barbara Sheriff's Office Main Jail for Santa Barbara Superior Court cases, the Santa Maria Sheriff's Substation for Santa Maria or Lompoc Superior Court cases. A copy of the order shall be made and retained in the youth's permanent file.
