- a. Toothpaste is to be dispensed to each youth in a clean small paper cup. The cups are to be returned to staff for disposal.
- b. To prevent the spread of disease the toothbrush should never be allowed to touch the tube of toothpaste.
- c. Toothbrushes are never to be shared among youth.
- d. Toothbrushes are disposed of upon the youth's release or transfer to another institution.
- 3. Worn toothbrushes (flat bristles) are to be replaced by staff as needed.
- 4. If there is any doubt about the ownership of a toothbrush or if staff suspects contamination of the toothbrush, it is to be replaced immediately.
- 5. Toothbrushes shall be disposed of in an area not accessible to youth.
- B. Upon intake or transfer, all youth are provided with a new comb.

### 6. Staff will closely supervise shaving to ensure maximum supervision is maintained. When multiple youth are shaving at the same time, staff will post at the entrance to the shower room and maintain continuous visual supervision.

- 7. Staff will retrieve the razor from the youth at the shower room entrance, inspect it to ensure the razor has not been tampered with, and replace the safety cap. The razor will be disposed of by staff in a designated container behind a closed and locked door away from any area accessible to youth.
- H. Female personal care items are provided to female youth upon request. Female personal care items include sanitary napkins and tampons.
- G. Ointment is provided upon request.
- H. Nail clippers
  - 1. Two sets of nail clippers, one large and one small, without an attached file, will be kept in each unit for use by the youth. When not in use, the clippers will be kept in an area not accessible to youth.
  - 2. When using the nail clippers, youth shall be supervised by a JIO. Nail clippers will never be given to a youth for use without direct supervision. Nail clippers in the unit are for single use only.
  - 3. Medical staff will maintain nail clippers and disinfect appropriately.
  - 5. Nail clippers are to be accounted for in all unit End of Shift reports.

### VI. Vermin Control

A. All youth clothing will be stored in a clean and vermin free storage area.

- B. All infested or otherwise contaminated youth personal clothing is placed in our "red" contamination bags and sent outside the facility for commercial cleaning.
- C. Clothing exposed to lice, bed bugs or scabies do not need to be placed in red contamination bags.
